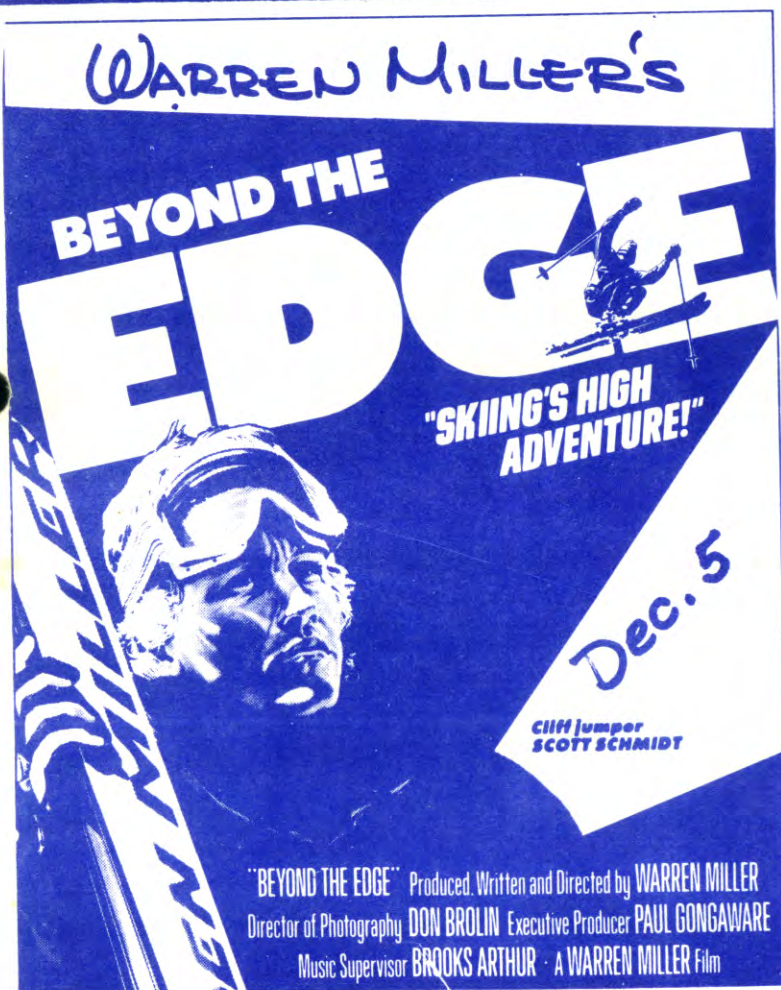

- INCOME COORDINATOR-** Coordinates advertising, merchandising, Swap, and Winter Film.
- ATHLETIC COORDINATOR-** Coordinates Volleyball, Tennis/Racquetball and chairs the nomination committee.
- JUNIOR BOARD MEMBERS-** (Two positions open) First time Board member, club historian.
- JUDICIAL COMMITTEE-** (Five positions) 1 year terms, no voting privileges rule on board actions and interpret the Constitution.

CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING WITH THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED

"Ski for Light, Inc." is announcing its seventh annual North Eastern Pennsylvania Regional program at Land of the Vikings, Sherman, PA (eight miles south of Deposit, NY) January 4 - 11, 1987.

"Ski for Light" offers a week of cross-country skiing for the visually impaired teamed up on a one-to-one basis with a sighted guide. Evening programs include socializing, dancing and fun.

If you are an experienced cross-country skier and would like to share your skills with others, "Ski for Light" needs you as a guide. No previous experience in working with the visually impaired is required.

The cost for the week is from \$192.00 and up, depending on the type accommodations chosen. This includes room and all meals. In addition there is a \$30.00 activity fee to cover evening and social programs.

Everyone involved with "Ski for Light" are volunteers and pay their own way. However, limited scholarships are available for those who need it.

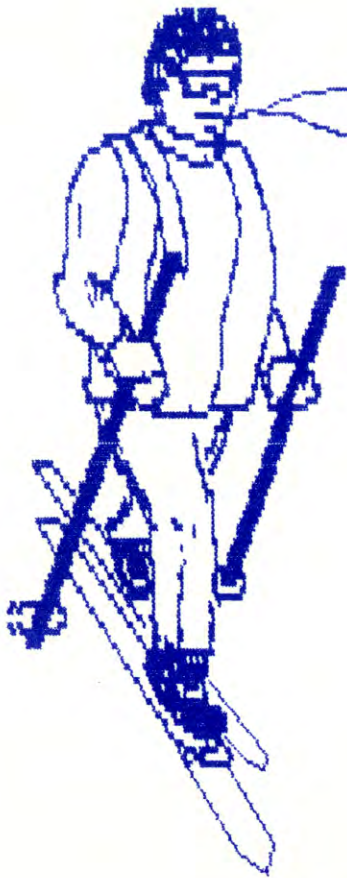

Imagine a ski season without Warren Miller. Can't? Well, you don't have to—he's back, for the 36th year, to cut the ribbon on another season.

Warren Miller was once the name of a Sun Valley ski instructor who ran around taking movies of things. Now it's Warren Miller *Productions*, subsidiary of Warren Miller *Enterprises*, syndicator of TV shows; creator, producer and distributor of ski, sailing and off-road racing films, instruction video-

tapes, a mini entertainment conglomerate whose namesake, the Sun Valley ski instructor who ran around taking movies of things, has achieved the zenith in celebrityhood by appearing not once, but twice on TV's *Lifestyles of the Rich and Famous* (OK, so it was a re-run).

Well, Miller doesn't himself point a camera much anymore, and f-stops, dissolves and light meters he frets over no longer. But he sure still does know how to script, edit, narrate... and get a skier's juices going, as a look at *Beyond the Edge*, his latest effort in documenting

the weird things skiers do, will show.

Every year we tell you this one is Miller's "best yet!" Well, this one *is*. Like a Chateau Lafite-Rothschild 1959, Miller's creative juices just get better in the aging.

OK, so how is this film different? For one, there are more women—and you're not sexist just because you enjoy the sight of beautiful skiers making beautiful turns in the snow. There's also some great windsurfing, snowboarding, car-top speed skiing (you read it right, Kirsten Culver and Sean Cridland play human hood ornaments at the Bonneville Salt Flats), a celebrity interview with Dr. Ruth (if you can believe that), even close-order maneuvers by the Vail lawn-chair drill team, a human torch that jumps cornices in a single bound, ski jumping as performed by the inmates of Dannemora (N.Y.) State Prison, and a title song written by Dan Fogelberg no less.

Not to say that those more familiar Miller touches are missing. Oh no, requisite Miller staples like helicopter skiing, freestyle flipping, World Cup racing, and Scott Schmidt and Tom Day (Miller: "They don't ski—they levitate.") are all there.

So is Miller's dead-pan narrative, in voice-overs like "If God had believed in permissiveness, he would have given us The Ten Suggestions."... "It's impossible to break a leg on a monoski. Both legs, yes."... "Hoping for deep powder snow in the East is hoping against hope, which is one of the more hopeless ways for the hopeful to hope."... "Now for a lesson in advanced dinner-check dodging."... "Chick who gets mink from wolf is a fox."... And, on snowboards, "What if the guy who invented skiing had grown up standing sideways on a skateboard? Today we would all be standing sideways riding snowboards instead of skis. Powder snow would only get used up half as fast. Twice as many people could fit on the hill. And if you fell standing sideways you'd only break the side of your body that's in front."

In this film, even Miller's imagination goes beyond the edge.

WINDJAMMER CRUISE

World Class Snow with snowmaking on 23 of 27 trails, 1500 vertical feet and 5 lifts. Trip includes continental breakfast, bus, lift tickets, refreshments and dinner at the Red Carpet Inn.

TOGGENBURG

Fourth annual Ski-N-Party Night. Ski, dance and party with the Syracuse, Rochester, Utica and Auburn Ski Clubs. Toggenburg features a new triple chair with access to advanced snowmaking terrain. Trip includes bus, exclusive use of lifts, beer, wine, soda, hors d'oeuvres and band. Price \$24.00, \$16.00 non skiers.

MT. SNOW Sold Out

Our 7th year staying with Bob and Barbara Hunter at the Red Cricket Inn. Enjoy the charm of a rustic Vermont Lodge with Apré ski activities such as fondue party, suana, game room and bar, cricket races or mellow out in front of one of the fireplaces. Mt Snow has expanded this year to 75 trails and 16 lifts. 15 seats will be held for cross-country skiers to ski the four local cross-country ski areas. Price includes breakfast and dinner Saturday and Sunday and lift tickets. Price \$188 double, \$182 triple, \$174 quad; \$143 double x-c, \$137 triple x-c, \$129 quad x-c.

SUCARBUSH

Sugarbush is a 2 day trip this year. The trip will stay in 3 and 4 bedroom condominiums with fireplaces and full kitchens. Happy hour before dinner on Saturday night will be at a nearby lodge and after dinner parties will be at the condos. Skiing will be at 2 areas: Sugarbush and Sugarbush North. Sugarbush and Sugarbush North offer 15 lifts, 80 trails, 2600 feet vertical and extensive top-to-bottom snowmaking.

WHITEFACE

Whiteface has 28 trails, (11 expert, 7 intermediate, 10 easier), 7 lifts and one of the highest vertical descents in the East with 3216 ft vertical drop. Increased snowmaking to 90% assures us of excellent snow. Extensive cross-country is available. Whether you plan to ski your buns off or just cool it -- the "value priced" trip to Whiteface in the Lake Placid region has it all.

LABRADOR

Includes a continental breakfast on the bus up, picnic lunch, lift ticket and a "happy Hour" on the bus home. New triple chair and additional snowmaking.

ELK MOUNTAIN

New Trip - Thurs Evening

Less than 1 hour away. Dinner on the bus. Six lighted trails, beginner through expert. Ski until 10:00 pm. Snacks on the way home.

STEAMBOAT, COLORADO

Ski the sundrenched Colorado Rockies at the height of the ski season, Feb 21-28th. Uncrowded slopes, 3,600 ft vertical, and a good mix of novice, intermediate, and expert terrain. Trip departs from Link Field, Saturday-to-Saturday flight and includes a five-day ski pass, deluxe two-bedroom condos with heated outdoor pool, hot tubs, pool party, and a farewell gourmet dinner. The trip is filling up fast.

MT. TREMBLANT

Ski 3 days (Friday thru Sunday) at Mont Tremblant in Quebec, Canada and dine on French cuisine at the St. Jovite Lodge. Mont Tremblant has 65 miles of trails, 25 trails, 2200 ft vertical Southside, 1800 ft vertical Northside, expanded snowmaking and new lifts. Trip includes bus, motel, 2 meals per day, lift tickets, food and drink on the bus. 60 miles of trails are available for cross-country skiers.

HUNTER

Friday trip including continental breakfast and a prime rib dinner. 16 lifts, 44 trails, 100% snowmaking, 2 hour ride from Binghamton.

STRATTON

Do it up with the Stratton Mountain Boys again this year! Short 4 hr bus ride to Southern Vermont. Stay in luxury condos at the base of the mountain and ski when you want to ski. Stratton Mt. with over 2000 vertical feet, 86 trails and extensive snow-making has installed two new quad chairs and added 6 new groomers. No meal plan, so plan to dine at one of Stratton's several restaurants or prepare your own in your condo kitchen. Other optional activities available include: ice skating, x-country, movies, shopping, horse-drawn sleigh ride, tobogganing, sauna, hot tub, tennis, racquetball and an exercise room. Stratton... the trip of your choice!

KILLINGTON Sold Out

This will be our 14th consecutive year for the Killington trip. New accommodations will be the Pinnacle Condominiums which are still located within walking distance to the lifts (or you can ride the shuttle bus which departs every 15 minutes). Condos include kitchens, fireplaces, exercise room with Universal Gym and ski tuning area, private lounge and health spa. Cost includes bus, lodging, 3 meals, lifts and sandwiches/snacks and drinks on the bus. Must be TCSC member and 21 years old to participate. Cost is \$225/person for lodging in 3 bedroom condo (max. occupancy 6 persons).
