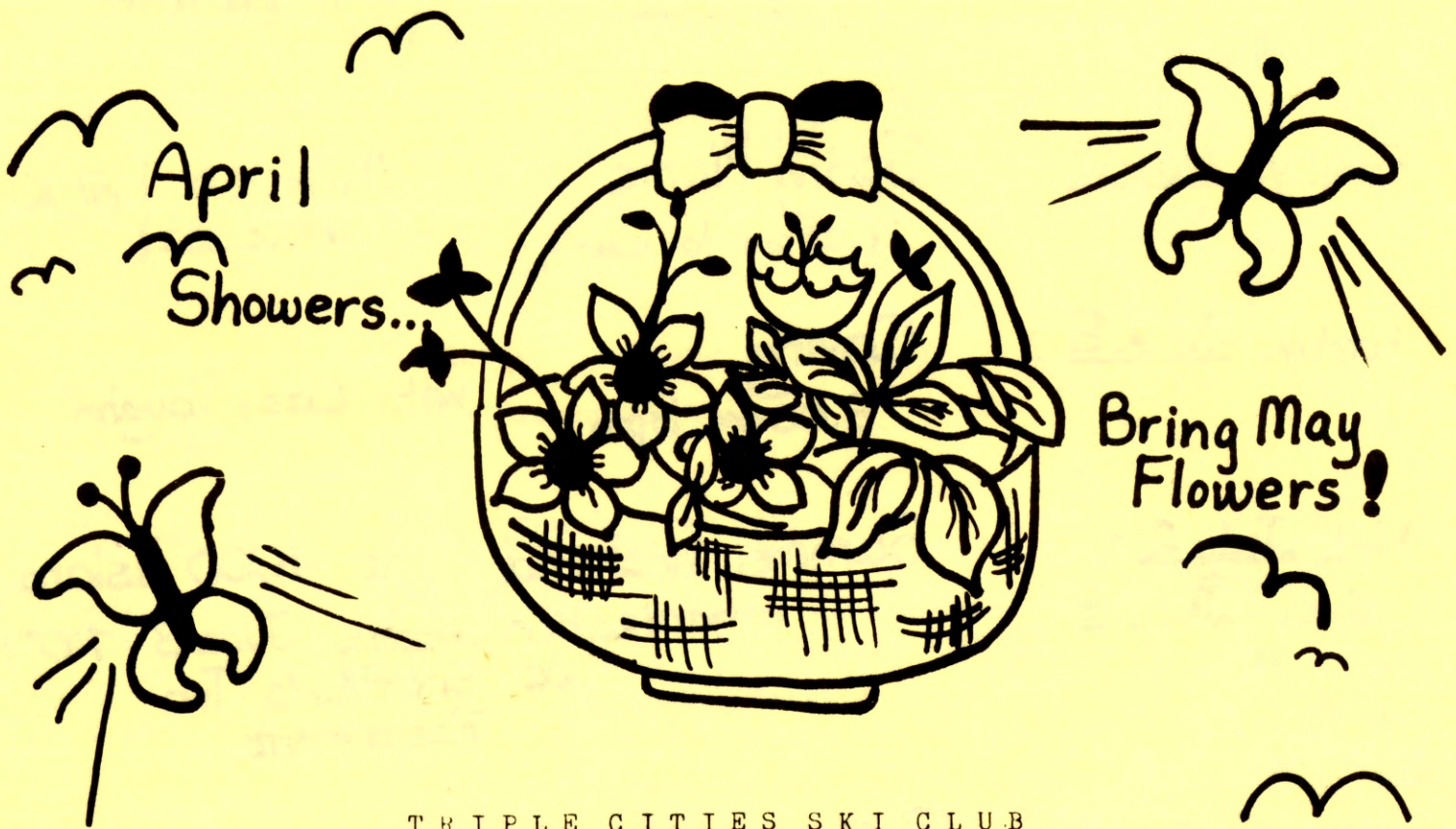

Caving

This is the real thing, folks! No paved walkways, electrically lit walls, tour guides, or cute names for formations.

I have chosen two caves to explore, which are very typical of the caves in this area. Caves are formed by water cutting through limestone, so each of these caves have small streams in them, and some of the basic formations. I will even go so far as to promise a bat.

This is a rugged trip ... you will be expected to be in good physical condition, be able to supply a hardhat/helmet, and three sources of light (e.g. carbide lamp, flashlights, candles, etc.), and not be afraid of cold, dark, wet places.

Caving is a lot of fun! It's like hiking in a whole new world. Come on and give it a try !!!

Date : Sunday, June 8th- all day (roughly 8AM to 8PM).
Transportation : Car pool.
Place : Schoharie Cty, New York (in the Howe Cavern area.)
Cost : Share of gas expenses, and dinner (about \$10 total).

Wear : VERY OLD CLOTHES. You will get very muddy! You must wear some sort of tough footwear ... hiking boots or workboots are strongly recommended ... sneakers will not give adequate grip. Caves are about 50 degrees all year round, so you need a few layers. Also bring a change of clothes/shoes and a sturdy garbage bag to put your mucky clothes in for the trip home.

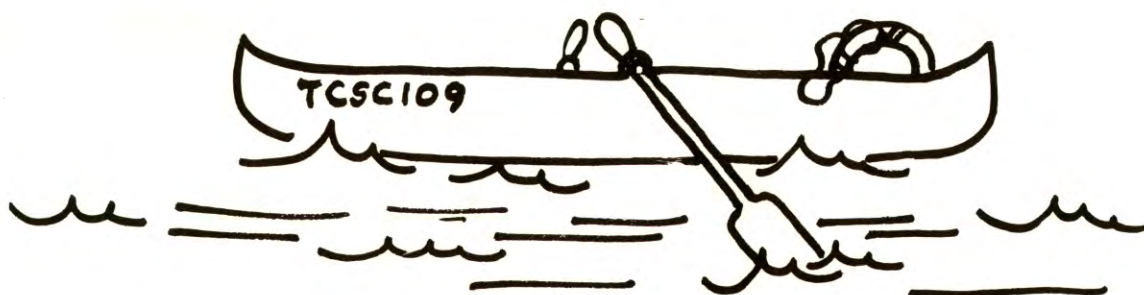

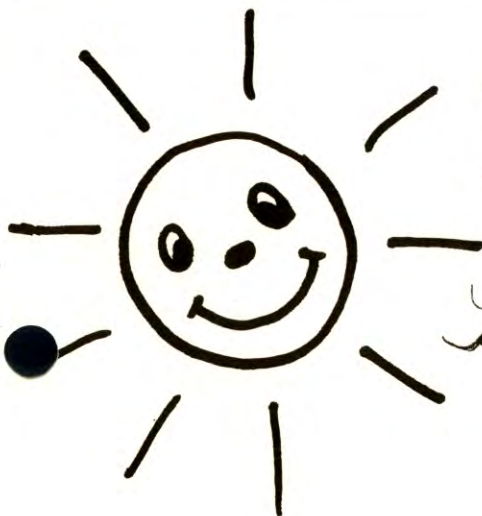
THANK YOU TCSC

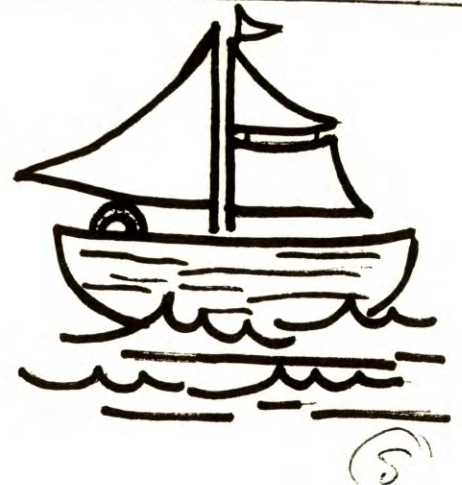
The cartoon plaques we received were extremely well done and in good taste. We will always look at them and have the fondest of memories for all of you - the TCSC

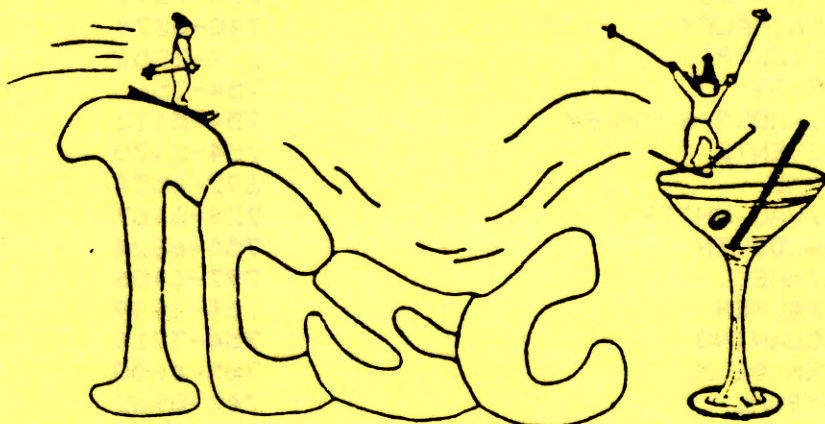
